MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING: STUDY SESSION OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS FOR THE OKLAHOMA AGRICULTRAL AND MECHNICAL COLLEGES SEPTEMBER 12, 2024

Notice of this special meeting was filed with the Oklahoma Secretary of State on August 26, 2024. This meeting was strictly an informal study session for the Regents, Board Staff, Oklahoma State University President Kayse Shrum, and their spouses/guests. No Board action was taken.

The Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges met for an informal Study Session on the campus of Oklahoma State University (OSU) in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

Others in Attendance: Mr. Jason Ramsey, Chief Executive Officer, and Dr. Kayse Shrum, President, Oklahoma State University and OSU System.

1. <u>Tour of the Food & Agricultural Products Center led by OSU Vice President and Dean</u> <u>of OSU Agriculture, Dr. Jayson Lusk.</u>

The Board gathered in the Food & Agricultural Products Center (FAPC) at approximately 9:00 a.m. to participate in a tour of the FAPC led by Dr. Jayson Lusk, Vice President and Dean of OSU's Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (OSU Agriculture).

Immediately following the conclusion of the tour, the Regents gathered in Conference Room 356 in Agricultural Hall at approximately 10:00 a.m. for the Study Session portion of the meeting.

2. <u>Overview of OSU Livestock Judging program with Livestock Judging Team Coach,</u> <u>Dr. Parker Henley.</u>

Coach Henley joined the meeting and provided the Regents with an overview of the OSU Livestock Judging program's history and many years of success. (A copy of the handout provided by Coach Henley is identified as ATTACHMENT B and attached to these minutes.)

3. Meet & greet with OSU Athletic Director Chad Weiberg and Athletics Department Staff.

Mr. Weiberg joined the meeting and provided an update on OSU Athletics. Head coaches for men's basketball, women's tennis, track, equestrian, and football also joined the meeting and provided overviews of their programs for the Regents.

(Regent Callahan joined the meeting at approximately 12:50 p.m.)

4. <u>Discussion related to priorities for the 2025 academic year, which will include discussion</u> with OSU President Kayse Shrum, other OSU administrators, and Board Staff.

President Shrum joined the meeting and provided the Regents with a progress report on the OSU Strategy. President Shrum discussed various objectives of the OSU Strategy, including topics such as: access to education, student success, retention, fostering "Cowboy Culture" at OSU, teaching, research, funding, extension, and increasing efficiencies. (A copy of the presentation made by President Shrum titled, "We are Land-Grant Strategy Update" is on file in the Board of Regents' Office as Doc. No. 1-9-12-24 and considered a part of these minutes.)

OSU Foundation Discussion

Ms. Blaire Atkinson, President of the OSU Foundation (OSUF), joined President Shrum and the Regents to discuss fundraising efforts by the OSUF and how they relate to the goals and objectives outlined by the OSU Strategy.

Discussion of OSU Veterinary Medicine Authority

Dr. Jim Hess, CEO of the OSU Veterinary Medicine Authority (OSUVMA), joined the meeting to discuss plans for the Authority's future in light of the dedicated funding that was gained when the legislature established the OSUVMA in 2023.

Scholarship Legislation Discussion

Mr. Ramsey, Chief Executive Officer for the A&M Board of Regents, presented the Regents with information about an existing program that provides tax credits to incentivize donors to provide needs-based scholarship dollars for K-12 private school students. This program was established by the Oklahoma Legislature in 2011. He explained that this program has higher income threshold limits than Oklahoma's Promise, so more families can qualify for aid. Further, creating a similarly structured program for higher education would incentivize donors to provide assistance for students and families to pursue higher education. This would address a great need for higher education by providing additional dollars for need-based aid. Legislation for this scholarship has been offered during previous legislative sessions and is expected to be offered again in the upcoming session. IVESTOCK JUDGING

HISTORICAL REVIEW

Frank Burtis introduced livestock evaluation at OSU in 1899. He requested literature from registered livestock associations because despite the variety of livestock breeds at the experiment farm, most were of poor quality and far from breed standards.

In 1902, Burtis took his students to the American Royal Livestock Exposition at Kansas City for their first competition out of Oklahoma.

John A. Craig, director of the station beginning in 1908 and a leading international authority on livestock, purchased Percheron draft horses from France and acquired the first purebred Dorset and Shropshire sheep imported from England. Craig developed the first criteria for livestock judging used at the turn of the century, was instrumental in establishing the International in Chicago, and led the first efforts to improve the breeding stock at OAMC.

Warren L. Blizzard joined the OAMC faculty on Feb. 18, 1915, only to discover there were no herd bulls for the beef cattle breeds. He quickly bought 28 head of breeding stock for the experiment station. Blizzard provided a stable academic environment and attracted experienced faculty who established careers with expertise in poultry, beef, dairy, swine, sheep and horses.

Quality stock judging coaches such as Blizzard and William Fowler challenged their college teams and raised expectations. The breeding program enhanced the quality of the livestock students were exposed to, college livestock won ribbons at state and regional competitions, and the results for the livestock judging team improved as well.

1913

In 1913, coach Charles I. Bray took the team to the International in Chicago for the first time, where they came in last. Team members had rarely worked with prize animals, and their scores reflected their inexperience.

The loss prompted the college to take steps to improve future stock judging outcomes. The Oklahoma Agricultural Experiment Station initiated efforts to enhance the livestock breeding programs and expanded acquisitions of registered stock from other states and countries, qualified faculty were hired, and new facilities were eventually built.

Due to the outbreak of Hoof and Mouth Disease in the United States, the International Livestock Exposition was cancelled in 1914 and 1915. Additionally, the involvement of the United States in World War I led to a significant drop in the number of colleges participating in livestock judging contests. Factors such as young men joining the Armed Forces, travel restrictions, and financial constraints on colleges contributed to this decline. As a result, Oklahoma A & M did not field a livestock judging team at the Chicago International Livestock Exposition from 1914 to 1918.



Member of the 1918 team, Albert Darlow, graduated from OAMC in 1919. He immediately joined the staff of the Animal Husbandry Department and began working on his master's degree, which he completed in 1922. He produced four national champion teams and five high individuals in the annual contest at the International Livestock Exposition in Chicago during the span of his decade as coach.

In 1935, Darlow left OAMC for the University of Wisconsin, where he served as head of the animal husbandry department and earned his doctorate in 1942. The topic of his doctoral thesis was "Effect of Plane of Nutrition on Reproduction Processes in the Ewe." He returned to Stillwater the following year to serve as the head of the OAMC animal science department.


From 1953 until his retirement in 1964, Darlow served as dean of the OAMC Division of Agriculture and vice president of agriculture, serving the university and his students well for more than 20 years.



At the national contest in Chicago, the team scored 4,459 points out of a possible 5,000. The team was first in horses, third in cattle, fourth in sheep and seventh in hogs. Louis E. Hawkins and Charles W. Weathers tied for seventh place individual with scores of 902. With the win, the team received the traveling Union Stock Yard and Transit Co. Trophy of a bronze bull and man, which weighed about 300 pounds.

The technical violation was complained about by the coaches of Nebraska and Purdue, who were also in the arena with their teams. The entire Oklahoma A&M team was disqualified for this technical violation.







Bridging the Financial Gap:^{ATTACHMENT C} A Scholarship Opportunity for Higher Education

What is it?

The Oklahoma Equal Opportunity Education Scholarship Act (EOS) was established by the Oklahoma Legislature in 2011 to provide taxpayers the opportunity to donate specifically toward providing needs-based tuition assistance scholarships to parents who desire to send their children to private school but can't afford it.


How does it work?

The current **EOS** structure provides an income tax credit for qualifying donations as follows:

- An income tax credit of 50% for donations to a scholarship-granting organization certified by the Oklahoma Tax Commission.
- Donations of the same or greater amount for two consecutive years are allowed an income tax credit of 75% for each of the two years.
- Tax credits are capped at \$100,000 for qualified business donors, \$2,000 for taxpayers filing a joint tax return, and \$1,000 for individual tax filers.

What are the benefits of giving?

The structure of **EOS** is very beneficial to donors compared to traditional gifts to college and university foundations. It allows schools to raise funds for this program from supportive donors with <u>no realized cost to the donor</u> after the application of the tax credit and deductions.



Who qualifies for these scholarships?

*Donation amount shown assumes a non-itemized tax deduction, treated as a business expense, with a two-year commitment of \$20,000/year.

Families qualify for a scholarship with **EOS** if they make less than the amount listed in each bracket below. For example, f you have a family of four and you make less than a total of \$173,160/year, you qualify!

- Family of 1: up to \$83,583
- Family of 2: up to \$113,442
- Family of 3: up to \$143,301
- Family of 4: up to \$173,160

When comparing these limits to those that qualify for higher education support through Oklahoma's Promise, they are drastically different. OK Promise currently caps out at an \$80,000 family income level.

Why higher education?

Establishing an "EOS-style" program for higher education could bridge the gap for many Oklahomans by implementing **needs-based scholarships**. It will benefit the state by providing a more educated workforce and will help those with financial needs graduate with minimal debt.

The K-12 private school tax credits are capped at \$25,000,000 annually. If an equivalent cap is created for higher education and the program is marketed successfully, it gives Oklahoma higher education an opportunity for more than \$25,000,000 of annual, need-based support for students.
